COVID-19 UPDATES

Ohio's COVID-19 Vaccine Town Halls start Feb. 22

There are a lot of myths about COVID-19 vaccines. Ohio's COVID-19 Town Halls will help answer questions and provide access to accurate information about vaccines. - Tuesday, March 2, 6:30 p.m. Rural Ohioans

When can I get my COVID-19 vaccine? Ohioans eligible:

🖌 Age 65+

- Those with severe congenital or developmental disorders and medical conditions listed in the <u>Priority Populations Fact Sheet</u>.
- Employees of K-12 schools that wish to remain or return to in-person or hybrid models.

Feb. 15 - <u>Ohioans born with or who have early childhood conditions that</u> <u>are carried into adulthood</u>, which put them at a higher risk for adverse outcomes due to COVID-19, may choose to receive the vaccine at the provider of their choice, but will be asked by their vaccine provider to confirm that they are, in fact, eligible at this time.

INDUSTRY INFORMATION

Ohio's curfew lapsed on Feb. 11 at noon, meaning that a statewide curfew is no longer in effect. Bars, restaurants, can stay open later, following the latest <u>orders</u> and <u>sector-specific guidance</u>.

FALKING POINTS FOR YOU

■ The COVID-19 vaccine supply is extremely limited, and the priority is being given to Ohio's most vulnerable residents and school personnel, who have committed to remaining open or reopening schools full time or in hybrid mode by March 1.

■ Trust the facts: the COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective. COVID-19 vaccines currently available in the U.S. were rigorously tested and do not give you COVID-19 or cause a positive COVID-19 test.

■ We have to do all that we can to continue protecting ourselves and others from contracting and spreading COVID-19. It's important that we continue to wash our hands regularly, maintain social distancing, and wear our masks anytime we are out with others.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

 \checkmark Set a good example, by wearing a mask, making virtual accommodations, and maintaining social distance when meeting face-to-face with others.

 \checkmark Post on social media to describe how you are working to keep your employees and customers safe (and what they can do to help you maintain a safe environment) using the suggested hashtags.

✓ Submit letters to the editor or local news outlets that support the importance of key messages: wear a mask, wash hands often, and practice social distancing.
